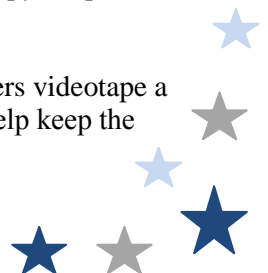
Message from the Chairman and President

The USO of Metropolitan Washington continued to reach new heights in 2009. We've increased our individual instances of service by more than 50 percent and we've developed several new and exciting programs. We've improved USO-Metro's organizational brand and have broadened our reach to serve more military installations around the region, increasing our visibility in both the communities we serve and the media. Each and every day, our enthusiastic staff and dedicated volunteers help us achieve our mission of lifting the spirits of America's troops and their families by providing first-class programs and services to the more than 500,000 active duty military in the Washington-Baltimore metropolitan area.

Serving those who serve, and their families...

Hospital Services

- USO-Metro hospital services support service members and their families who are recovering at Walter Reed Army Medical Center, National Naval Medical Center, Warrior Transition Units at Ft. Meade, Ft. Belvoir and McGuire Richmond VAMC. We support these military heroes and their families through programs including celebrity handshake tours, therapeutic activities, Texas hold'em tournaments, emergency housing, excursions and on-site concerts by well-known entertainers.
- For the second year in a row, Microsoft hosted active duty military and their families at the Radio City Music Hall Christmas Spectacular featuring the Rockettes. As part of the event, USO-Metro brought 25 wounded warriors from area military hospitals to New York City for the show and a unique, VIP weekend with celebrity and distinguished military guests – including ADM Michael Mullen, GEN James Cartwright and GEN Peter Chiarelli – surprising troops throughout the weekend.
- This summer we began our new Horses for Heroes program with the Virginia Therapeutic Riding Association. Equine therapy is proven to improve balance and transferring skills, assist service members with confidence in group settings and build morale. The 8-week session was made possible through a \$25,000 grant from BAE Systems.
- We escorted more than 130 celebrities through the wards of our military medical facilities, including visits from Angelina Jolie, Jack Nicholson, Miss America and Renee Zellweger.
- We are committed to recognizing hospital staff at WRAMC and NNMC for the work that they do to care for our military. Three times a year we support the QUEST for Excellence Program at WRAMC to honor outstanding staff. In addition, this year we hosted a thank you BBQ for more than 5,500 hospital staff.
- USO-Metro hosted a premiere of Lifetime TV's hit show "Army Wives" at Walter Reed Army Medical Center. Stars and producers of the show attended the special event, along with General and Mrs. George W. Casey, Chief of Staff of the Army.
- Professional poker players from across the nation joined a group of 100 wounded warriors for a poker tournament at Walter Reed. Celebrity players included Howard Lederer, Gavin Griffin, Andy Bloch, Victor Ramdin, Phil Gordon, Rhett Butler, Poker After Dark host Leeann Tweeden and Dennis Philips from the World Series of Poker's Main Event.
- Through USO-Metro, the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff hosted a luncheon for the spouses of 25 wounded warriors at his home – a truly special honor for these caregivers.
- USO-Metro has started providing grocery store gift cards to wounded warriors using the family integration kitchen at Walter Reed's Medical Advanced Training Center (MATC). The kitchen serves as occupational therapy for patients and helps families reconnect in a private environment.
- We've implemented a pilot program for United Through Reading in area military hospitals. Volunteers videotape a parent reading a children's book and then mail the book and recorded DVD to the child at home to help keep the parent child relationship in tact while patients recovers.



- Southern Management sponsored an excursion to Bear Creek Resort for 20 wounded warriors from the WRAMC psychiatric unit. Throughout the day the patients went fishing, hiking, kayaking and boating.

Operation USO Care Package (OUCP)

- Operation USO Care Package will hit another milestone – 1.5 million care packages!
- In April, in honor of the Month of the Military Child, we hosted our first stuffing party for kids with the Department of Defense Military Health Services and Booz Allen Hamilton. The children stuffed 2,500 care packages, exceeding the goal of 500.
- This year when the Super Bowl Champion Pittsburgh Steelers visited the White House to meet the president they wanted to do something a little different. Enter OUCP! In about an hour, the president and first lady, along with the Super Bowl winners stuffed approximately 2,000 care packages on the south lawn of the White House.
- This May, for National Military Appreciation Month, senators and congressman joined the USO for a Capitol Hill stuffing party assembling 3,000 USO care packages for troops serving overseas and raising awareness of USO programs.
- Prior to his USO tour overseas, Stephen Colbert and the staff of the “Colbert Report” participated in an OUCP stuffing party. Tom Hanks joined the show for the party.
- Operation USO Care Package was featured on the Today Show. Our OUCP team stuffed care packages with Dr. Jill Biden and the shows’ hosts Matt Lauer, Meredith Veiera, Anne Currie, Al Roker and Tiki Barber.

USO Airport Lounges

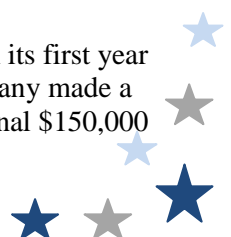
- In honor of Military Family Month, this past November we held our 5th annual salute to veterans and families at BWI Thurgood Marshall Airport’s International Terminal followed by a reception in our USO Lounge at BWI. Distinguished guests included keynote speaker Congressman John Sarbanes, Lt. Governor Anthony Brown, Col. Daniel Thomas from Fort Meade and Mrs. Deborah Mullen. Additionally, USO BWI volunteer and Gold Star mom, Carol Roddy, was invited on stage to recognize the important role family plays for military personnel.
- Nearly 300 guests helped raise more than \$15,000 by attending our 3rd annual Oktoberfest celebration at Michael’s Eighth Avenue in Glen Burnie, MD sponsored by Skye Hospitality and Southern Management.
- USO volunteers have been working in conjunction with Honor Flight, Inc. to welcome WWII vets as they come to Washington to visit the WWII and Iwo Jima memorials. The welcome these veterans receive is one of the most unforgettable moments during their visit. Mrs. Mullen, Mrs. Cartwright and a host of other General Officer’s spouses have participated.
- Our BWI volunteers are leading the effort to make United Through Reading a success! This program began in October, since then over 300 books and videos have been mailed to children whose parents are deployed to areas of conflict.

TicketLine

- More than 25,500 tickets were given to troops and their families through USO-Metro TicketLine this year!
- Our TicketLine program is one of our most requested services by the troops. We would especially like to thank Lockheed Martin and Larry Duncan who donate tickets to their suite at Redskins games, The Boeing Company, Eric Gioia and Doug Wagoner of SAIC, as well as Northrop Grumman and BAE Systems for donations to the TicketLine Program.

Mobile USO

- Following an official ribbon cutting by Marine Corps Commandant General Conway at the Pentagon, in its first year of operations the Mobile USO program has enabled us to reach over 225,000 people. The Boeing Company made a \$700,000 commitment to the program. The grant covered the cost of building the vehicle and an additional \$150,000



per year for three years for its operation. This is the largest single cash donation ever received by the USO of Metropolitan Washington. Additionally, The Boeing Company employee volunteers have given over 160 hours of service so far to support program operations.

- The Mobile USO has participated events including deployment ceremonies, homecoming celebrations, air shows, the Marine Corps Marathon, field training activities and parades.

Programs and Services

- Successful Deployed Family Fun Days were held at Fort Meade, MD and the Coast Guard's Telecommunication and Information Systems Command (TISCOM) facility in Alexandria, VA. Hundreds of military families attended the events that were full of prizes, refreshments, activities, entertainment and numerous resources for families with a deployed loved one. Thanks to Health Net Federal Services for sponsoring this important military community activity.
- Our emergency housing program continues to support military families in crisis. We've refurbished our emergency housing unit at Fairlands Apartment complex thanks to Northrop Grumman-Electronics division and their employee volunteers, and fully furnished another unit thanks to Jim Senker of Corporate Rentals. We would also like to recognize our corporate partners who make the space available: Southern Management, Oakwood Worldwide and Equity.
- Movies on the Lawn launched this summer thanks to Booz Allen Hamilton's sponsorship of this exciting new program. The screen and equipment is designed to project movies to a crowd of 750 people. Over 1,000 service members and their families attended events at Fort Belvoir, Walter Reed Army Medical Center, Aberdeen Proving Grounds and Bolling Air Force Base. Along with a two-year \$25,000 per year commitment, BAH employees have served as fabulous volunteers for the program!

Holiday Programs

- BAE Systems continues to make the holidays brighter for active duty military and their families through USO-Metro. Employees purchased and assembled 600 bikes again this year for junior enlisted personnel, and BAE committed \$5,000 for holiday parties at the outreach centers where the bicycles were distributed. In partnership with BAE, Wal-Mart committed \$10,000 in Wal-Mart gift cards that were distributed to military families in need during the holidays.
- Over 20 hotels participated in our Holiday Hotel Program and 450 military personnel and their families were assisted with room nights for visiting family members of those military personnel who are unable to go home for the holidays. Thank you to our supporters of this program Ron Frank and Pat Green of Southern Management, Marriott Sheraton National and Daphne Melillo at Oakwood Worldwide.
- We were proud to provide baskets of food and goodies to nearly 500 service members in need during both Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays. We worked closely with the Springfield and Arlington chapters of VFW, as well as Rolling Thunder.
- During our Santa Cookie Run USO volunteers delivered goodies to 567 service members who were away from their families on Christmas Eve this past year. A special thanks to Angella Reid for bringing several dozen cookies, and to John Marselle for helping with the delivery to the service members on duty at Andrews AFB and Fort McNair.
- Our very busy holiday season was filled with holiday parties at each of our outreach centers. Health Net Federal Services sponsored our Celebration of Children Party at Fort Myer again this December. We bussed in more than 220 children of military families to a winter wonderland from the North Pole, complete with Santa and Mrs. Claus, gifts, carnival games, cartoon characters, clowns, moon bounces and so much more. Thank you to Sue Mandry-Schwartz and Health Net Federal Services.

Capital Affairs...

- USO-Metro had an unprecedented presence during the Inauguration of President Barrack Obama. The Mobile USO was stationed on The Ellipse to support the more than 1,500 troops working the Inaugural parade. We supported several inaugural balls, transporting wounded warriors and their guests and securing exciting entertainers! Finally, we were honored to be selected to have one of only six floats in the Inaugural parade.



- At our Annual Awards Dinner in March, we had the privilege of honoring heroes past and present, including 30 of the living 99 Medal of Honor recipients in attendance and active duty service members who have served their country with extraordinary valor. We introduced a new USO-Metro Award named in honor of former board member and dinner committee chairman John Gioia, which was given to a USO volunteer who served in World War II, Korea and Vietnam, Carlo DePorto. Our Legacy of Hope Award was presented to the NFL Alumni Association in recognition of the support our military receives from a number of former NFL players and coaches. Thanks to Mike Singer for serving as chairman for this important event.
- To celebrate July 4th, the Mobile USO made its way down Constitution Avenue. After the parade, 35 volunteers from the USO of Metropolitan Washington joined 80 volunteers from USO, Inc. to support the president and Michelle Obama's 4th of July Celebration on the White House lawn for 2,500 service members and their families.
- Fort Myer Commander, COL Laura Richardson, along with 550 hungry troops and their families joined USO-Metro and our friends from Papa John's for a Pizzapalooza in June to celebrate the Army birthday. USO Board Member COL Bill Freitas was on hand to present USO-Metro with a \$75,000 check raised during their "Pizza for Patriots" campaign.
- This year the AFCEA/USO Golf Tournament raised \$124,000 for the USO and donated \$10,000 to the AFCEA Scholarship Fund.
- For the 5th year the Cincinnati volunteer committee organized the Riverfest fundraiser, raising \$550,000 to support our hospital programs.
- At our Casino Night benefit guests mingled with celebrities, professional poker players and wounded warriors, raising more than \$100,000 to support our troops. Special thanks to Paul McQuillan for again serving as the chairman for this fantastic event, and thanks to those who donated exciting live and silent auction items.
- USO/BWI Business Partnership Golf Tournament at Lake Presidential in Bowie, MD brought together a number of Baltimore businesses and USO guests from the military and government agencies. The first place foursome donated their winnings to the wounded warriors from Walter Reed who joined us for the day!

Communications and Technology...

- With the help of O'Keeffe and Co. our new website is up and running, serving as a powerful tool for telling our story to our customers, volunteers, donors and media.
- To bring news of our programs and services directly to our customers, we've implemented the use of social media platforms like Facebook and Twitter. With daily updates, we're spreading the word about USO-Metro, while receiving valuable interaction and feedback from those we serve.
- We are incorporating the use of two new software programs: Volgistics allows us to better communicate with, schedule and track the service of the more than 5,000 volunteers who make our work possible. Cvent has streamlined our guest registration and sponsorships process for special events and fundraisers.
- USO-Metro placed more than 100 stories in print and broadcast media. Our annual awards dinner garnered excellent coverage thanks to the hard work of Advice Unlimited.
- We've upgraded and integrated our computer hardware and systems. Thanks to Cisco, Microsoft and Verizon for their technical support throughout the process.

Awards and Recognition...

- USO-Metro received two Seven Seals awards from the Maryland Committee for Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve (ESGR). The Seven Seals Award is the highest award given by ESGR, and was created to publicly recognize




groups who provide outstanding patriotic support and cooperation to employees and families of those who have been called to serve.

- We received the “Organization of the Year” award at the BWI Business Partnership’s Annual Meeting for dedicated assistance to traveling service members and their families at the Baltimore Washington International Airport (BWI) USO Lounge.

Looking Ahead...


- USO, Inc. and USO-Metro are in discussion with military leadership at Walter Reed Army Medical Center and the National Naval Medical Center at Bethesda to design and build two facilities to support our wounded warriors and their families at the new Walter Reed National Military Medical Center and Fort Belvoir Community Hospital campuses. USO, Inc. and USO-Metro will partner to raise the necessary funds to build and operate the new facilities.
- In November we will celebrate the 10th Anniversary of the USO Lounge at BWI! Since the USO lounge at BWI Airport opened in 1999, over 600,000 service members and their families have walked through the doors. Every month, this "home away from home" welcomes up to 10,000 military personnel and family members who are traveling through BWI. A team of 200 loyal USO volunteers have donated over 164,000 hours of their time to the USO Lounge. The event will feature Miss America and LTG Pollett, Director, DISA.
- Operation USO Care Package will introduce care packages designed specifically for female troops serving abroad and will also test a new military family care package.
- We will reopen the USO Center at Indian Head in December of 2009. We’d like to thank Dick Lombardo and Harkins Builders for the renovation that includes a new kitchen, a new bathroom, new floors and fresh paint. Through the use of sustainable materials throughout the remodel, this will be our first green USO! The USO Center will also offer Wi-Fi, video gaming and a computer lab. Our request to expand our service area has been approved by USO, Inc. and we will work with the command at Naval Support Facility Dahlgren and Indian Head to service troops and their families at this new location. Special thanks to board member Jim Senker of Corporate Rentals who donated furniture for both Centers.
- Throughout the coming year, our airport services staff will work with USO, Inc. to identify ways to serve families of the fallen in their time of need.
- In December 2009, Microsoft will partner with USO-Metro to bring the magic of the Radio City Christmas Spectacular to Washington. Microsoft will sponsor the December 20 show at the Verizon Center, enabling 8,200 area service members and their families to enjoy this popular Christmas experience for free!

The USO of Metropolitan Washington has weathered a difficult economic climate this past year thanks, in large part, to the leadership of our finance committee. Their vision and commitment to not only maintaining, but improving the level of service we are able to provide to the men and women of our armed services is incredible. It is through the generous support of our board of directors, staff and volunteers, as well individuals and organizations in the local community that USO-Metro is able to fulfill its mission.

Programs and Services

USO Airport Lounges and Assistance

USO-Metro operates four locations in local airports to assist military travelers. Three airport lounges are located at Reagan National Airport, Baltimore/Washington International Airport and Washington Dulles International Airport. USO Lounges are staffed by knowledgeable USO volunteers and offer complimentary services to traveling service members and their families, including baggage storage, Internet access, a large screen TV, and snack bar. USO-Metro also provides an Assistance Center at Andrews Air Force Base where volunteers assist military travelers with information and directions.

Hospital Services

USO-Metro works closely with Walter Reed Army Medical Center, the National Naval Medical Center at Bethesda, Warrior Transition Units at Ft. Meade and Ft. Belvoir, as well as the McGuire Richmond VAMC to provide entertainment, services and support for service members injured in the war on terror. USO-Metro supports wounded warriors and their families through various programs including celebrity handshake tours, therapeutic activities like “Horses for Heroes,” Texas hold em’ tournaments, emergency housing and food assistance, excursions and on-site concerts by well-known entertainers.

USO Centers

USO-Metro has three centers located in military communities – Fort Belvoir and Fort Myer, Virginia; and Fort Meade, Maryland. USO Centers offer programs geared to enlisted personnel and their families. Family programs include community days, holiday programs, youth enrichment programs, teen nights, movie nights, bingo, child welfare classes and distribution of child safety seats. USO Centers promote a sense of community for military personnel and their families who move frequently during their career.

Mobile USO

Sponsored by the Boeing Company, this state-of-the-art vehicle provides programs and services to military installations throughout the region. With custom features like a complete kitchen, satellite TV and video gaming equipment along with a crew of friendly and helpful volunteers, the Mobile USO delivers signature USO service anywhere, anytime. Look for the mobile at military community events and training exercises, deployments, homecomings, parades, air shows and military marathons – wherever the military needs us!

Emergency Programs

USO-Metro offers emergency housing and food assistance to military families in extreme financial or medical crisis. USO-Metro maintains twenty-five furnished apartments that are available for up to 60 days at no cost to local military families. USO-Metro also coordinates the S.H.A.R.E. Program at Fort Belvoir and Woodbridge Run, Virginia, as well as Indian Head, Maryland and provides food and/or gift certificates to grocery stores to families in need. USO-Metro works closely with military family service agencies and the local commands ensuring that strict eligibility criteria are met for emergency assistance.

TICKETLINE

USO-Metro distributes thousands of free and low cost tickets to professional sports games, concerts, and cultural events to active duty military personnel and their families. The TicketLine is a 24-hour dedicated phone line (703-696-2551) which describes current ticket opportunities. Tickets are donated to USO-Metro by area venues and by generous corporations and individuals. (To donate tickets please call 703-696-0958. All donations are tax deductible.)

Holiday Programs and Services

Holidays are especially important for military families who often experience extended separations. Each holiday season, USO-Metro provides free hotel rooms to visiting family members of junior enlisted personnel stationed in the area. Other holiday support includes Thanksgiving and Christmas food baskets, holiday parties at area military installations and hospitals, and adopt a military child programs.

Guide to Washington and Baltimore

This directory is a single source for military personnel with information about all area military installations and many tourist attractions in Washington, D.C. and Baltimore. USO-Metro publishes and distributes 50,000 issues annually to local military commands. The *Guide to Washington and Baltimore* is officially sanctioned by the military.

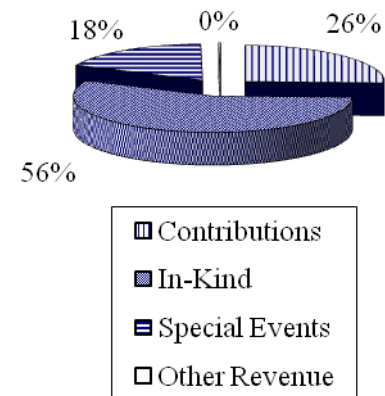
Treasurer's Report

Their report stated that the financial position of the USO of Metropolitan Washington and the results of its operations and cash flows are fairly presented in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. A copy of the auditor's report and complete financial statements are available at the administrative offices of the USO of Metropolitan Washington. OUCP is Operation USO Care Package. This is an international care package program, the operations of which are run by USO of Metropolitan Washington for USO World Headquarters. OUCP is accounted for on USO World Headquarter books. OUCP income and expense is also provided to better reflect the scope of responsibility of USO-Metropolitan Washington.

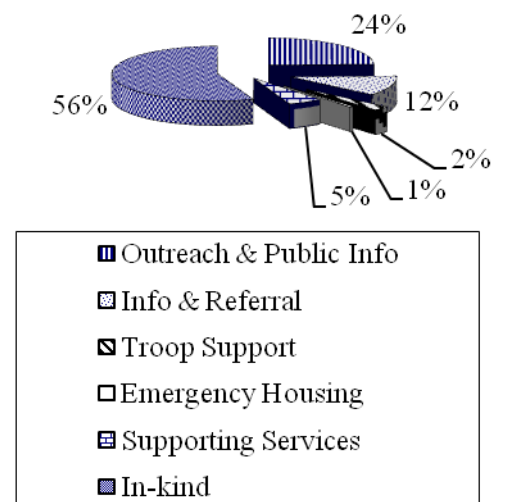
